Augustine M. (Tina) Gaffney passed away on November 2 at age 95 in her new home in Oswego, NY. She was born in Solvay, NY into a loving family who immigrated from Spain circa 1920. Augustine is the widow of Joseph R. Gaffney, her husband of 62 years.
