Barbara Ann Armani passed away suddenly Friday, December 20, 2024. She was beloved by her surviving family: her sisters, Beverly Armani and Patti Tuori, of Solvay. 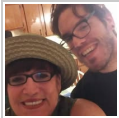

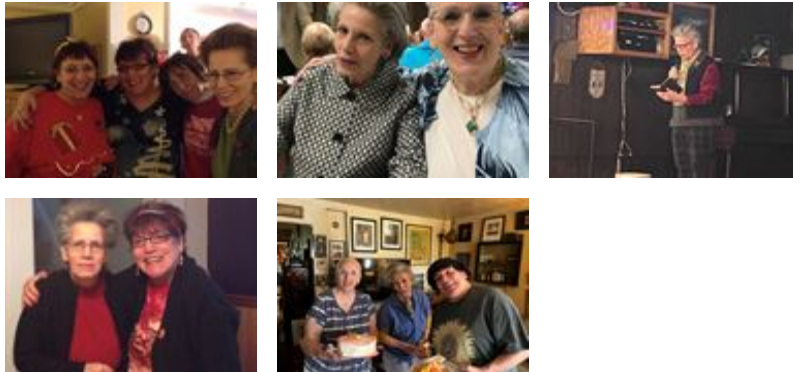
