Barbara H. Miesner, 88, of 7174 Obrien Road passed away Sunday, January 7, 2024, with family by her side. She continued her church secretary career with the First United Methodist Church and the Full Gospel Church in Wellsville, and the Hallsport Christian Church. She was a member of the Hallsport Christian Church and enjoyed reading, gardening, and canning. She was famous for her special potato salad everyone enjoyed at family picnics. Barb was a woman of strong faith and loved the Lord. In 2016 she moved to Syracuse to be near Heidi who cared for her until her passing. She enjoyed the comradery and good times with her many good friends at the Obrien

apartments.
