



CARMEN LONGO

April 8, 1925 - May 30, 2020

Carmen Longo, 95, of Solvay, passed away Saturday May 30th at Francis House. He was born in Syracuse to the late Donato and Frances (Delia) Longo in 1925. Carmen served as a First Class Signalmans in the Amphibious Force of the US Navy during WW II. Having been stationed in the South Pacific, he participated in the battles of Saipan, Tinian and Okinawa and was honorably discharged in 1943.

He worked at Iroquois China for 30 years, followed by RJ Reynolds Co. where he was a manager and chef at Merchant's Bank for over 16 years before retiring in 1987. He was also co-owner, along with his wife, of Longo's Cleaners in Solvay for more than 50 years. He was a member of the Stanley B. Pennock VFW Post 2893, the Geddes Vet's, the Tyrol Club of Solvay and a communicant of St. Marianne Cope Parish-St. Cecilia Church. He has always been an involved member of his community and has been known to help prepare meals for his church as well as other community events.

He is predeceased by his wife of 66 years, Josephine (Verdi) in 2013, his son, John in 2007 and 11 brothers and sisters.

Carmen is survived by his daughters, Marsha Brown and Sandra (Michael) Longo, both of Baldwinsville, 3 granddaughters, Amanda (Andrew) Knipfing, of Rochester, Ashley Brown, of Arizona and Samantha Longo, of Florida, his great-grandson, Wesley Knipfing, daughter-in-law, Nelly Longo, of Florida and several nieces and nephews.

Due to current restrictions, funeral services and the Rite of Committal in St.

Mary's Resurrection Chapel Mausoleum are private.
