It is with a heavy heart we announce that in the early morning of June 17th, 2020 our "family angel" Carrie Marie Salvetti, 94, passed away at Upstate Community Hospital. Carrie was born on May 7th, 1926, a daughter of the late Francesco and Giovannianna Salvetti. She was predeceased in life by her beloved brother Donald, "Saggie, Slitz" Salvetti and his wife Rosie Salvetti of Solvay, New York, and a sister, Mary Naples of Geddes, New York. She is survived by her nieces, Janet Mahoney, of Florida, Linda Hodge, of Camillus, her cousin, Bernard Salvetti, of Lakeland, and her godchildren, Colleen Monroe and Mary Ellen Del Prato, as well as many other loving family members and friends.

"Kakee" as she was fondly known, was a lifetime resident of Camillus and Warners, New York and a longtime employee of Pass & Seymour Incorporated. She was a communicant of St. Marianne Cope Parish-Saint Cecilia Church in Solvay, New York and later in life Holy Family Church in Camillus, New York. She was an award-winning cook and featured more than a few times in the Syracuse Post Standard for her baking accomplishments. Her Italian pastries and Baptismal and Communion cakes were well-recognized as some of the most authentic, delicious, and beautiful confections ever made. She enjoyed bowling, the New York Yankees, and spending time with her family. Her "Sunday dinners at the farm" remain unparalleled and an event few, when invited, would chance to miss.

Yet, above all, our "family angel" epitomized the words our Lord Jesus himself

said: "It is more blessed to give than to receive." and she lived her life as a perfect model of these words. Carrie cared for many of our family as well as others in their illnesses and times of need. She never forgot a special day in any of our lives, showed great courage and strength in the face of adversity, and has left us an unrivaled example of how to lead a life well-led. No one, especially children, would want for comfort, care, or love if she had a say in the matter and that endeared her to all that knew her.
