Douglas S. LaLone, 86, died peacefully the morning of Thursday, April 23 at his home surrounded by family. Born in Watertown, he moved to Syracuse in the 1950s where he worked at Syracuse China and would later retire from Carrier Corporation.

He loved riding motorcycles even into his 80's. Douglas also owned Legends, a biker bar on the north side of Syracuse. He was an avid hunter and collected antique firearms.

He is survived by his two sons, Doug (Tammy) and David (Teresa), nine grandchildren, and 13 great-grandchildren.

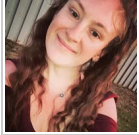
