



KENNETH J. CAMERON

July 27, 1952 - February 10, 2023

Kenneth James Cameron, 70, passed away on February 10, 2023. He was born on July 27, 1952 in Syracuse, NY. Ken graduated from Solvay High School class of 1972. After graduation he worked at General Motors for 21 years before moving on to work for Centro for 20 years. While working for Centro, he served for 6 years as the President of the Amalgamated Transit Union.

He loved being outdoors and over the years enjoyed snowmobiling, boating, riding his motorcycle and camping. He volunteered at Americade where he would guide motorcycle tours throughout the Adirondacks. Attending NASCAR races was another passion of his. Recently during the winter months, he enjoyed driving his RV to Florida with his wife and spending time in the Villages. More than anything he enjoyed spending time with his family and friends. He was always known for being the life of the party and knew how to have a good time. Ken was very well known for having clean cars. Over the years, hand washing his cars transitioned to driving through Delta Sonic on a daily basis.

He was predeceased in 2008 by his mother Rosemary Cameron. He is survived by his devoted wife of 49 years, Dianne (Ghezzi), two sons, Ryan M. (Christine) Cameron and Randy M. (Courtney) Cameron, and daughter, Tiffany L. (Robert) Dixon; 5 grandchildren, Payton, Brayden, Kyle, Hunter and Beckett; three sisters, Rosanne Larson, Linda Foster, and Janet Cameron. Since May of 2022, Ken was courageously fighting Acute Myeloid Leukemia

and was one week away from receiving his bone marrow transplant at Roswell Park Cancer Institute in Buffalo New York.
