Nicholas Anthony Tropea, age 95, passed away peacefully on December 22, 2025, in Cicero, New York. Born on March 16, 1930, in Harrison, New York, Nick lived a long and meaningful life defined by devotion to his family, service to his country and community, and a lifelong love of the casino.

Nick was the beloved son of Frank and Susan (Donato) Tropea. He graduated from White Plains High School in Westchester County, where he developed the strong work ethic and sense of responsibility that would guide him throughout his life.
