Robert Charles Radoane, 87, of Jamesville, passed away Monday, January 9, 2017 at the Syracuse VA Medical Center due to complications of multiple sclerosis. He was born in Syracuse, New York to the late Virginio “William” and Teresa (Bondoni) Radoane. He grew up in Solvay and was a graduate of Solvay High School. He was also a veteran of the Korean War, and was a past member of the General Pulaski Post 1650 and Tyrol Club of Solvay. He found interest in remodeling old houses and repairing things, and from there he became a master plumber in Onondaga County. For many years he operated Radco Plumbing and Heating, and was a member of the Plumbers and Steamfitters Union, Local 267. Robert is predeceased by one sister Mary Cary of Fayetteville, and two brothers, Julius of Camillus, and Edward of Silver Spring, Maryland.

He is survived by his wife of 54 years, Elaine (Bruer) Radoane; his daughters, Kim (Dr. Walter) Kersch, of Lexington, Virginia, and Bobbi Radoane, of Cheyenne, Wyoming; granddaughter, Chloe Kersch; and several nieces and nephews.
