



ROCCO A. GONNELLA

September 27, 1948 - December 9, 2023

Rocco A. Gonnella, 75, of Liverpool, affectionately known by his family and friends as “Rocky”, was born in Syracuse on September 27, 1948 to the late August and Ann (Kordak) Gonnella. He grew up in an Italian American neighborhood on Delhi Street. His home and others were later raised to build the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. School. Rocky graduated from Henninger in 1967. By then, one of his lifelong passions came to be realized. He developed into a star quarterback in Section 3 Athletics. Almost all high school football fans of the time knew who he was and respected his athletic ability. After high school, he went to college at the University of Nebraska Omaha on an athletic scholarship where he started at quarterback.

Upon graduation, Rocky taught and coached football at Liverpool High School. As described by a close friend, “Rocky loved the Lord and his great passion was telling others that they could come to know Jesus personally.” He joined Living Word Church in Syracuse, New York, where he became a lifelong member. He shared the Gospel as a street preacher at the bus stops downtown on Fayette and Salina streets.

Rocky began teaching at Living Word Academy in 1979 combining his passions for athletics and the Gospel. In addition to being the Phys Ed teacher and Athletic Director, he taught middle school Bible class, shared weekly sermons with high school students in chapel, and left a lasting legacy of zealous faith. He retired in 2014 after almost 40 years. He loved his brother, sister and nieces, as well as his Church family. Rocky will be missed by those

who loved him dearly.

Rocco is survived by his sister, Kathleen Gonnella, of Syracuse and many nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.

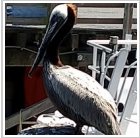

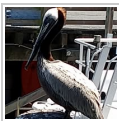
